FATHER'S REFLECTION: Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

As we celebrate the kingship of Christ, may we not forget His servant-leadership style! The servant leadership of Christ cannot be over-emphasized. For HIM, "no service no leadership and no kingship." He carried out this mission of servant leadership up to HIS CROSS and wants you and I, His disciples to continue this mission of serving and caring for one another especially the weak and less privileged in our society, as loudly espoused in the gospel of today. This feast reminds me of the lyrics of James Kilbane's hymn, "Who shall I send. . . Here I am Lord . . . I will hold your people in my heart". He has sent us. Do we take care of every one of God's people, or do we ignore some because they do not belong to our social class?
