FATHER'S REFLECTION: 28th Sunday A

Looking at the story of Jesus in the gospel, there is a danger of how certain good things could prevent us from answering the actual call of Jesus. Sounds weird but true! When we look at the story carefully, the things that prevented some (not all) of the invited guests to attend the wedding feast were not bad things. They cared more about work and business, which is reasonably good but not what the Lord wanted from them at that moment. Good things are nice, but sometimes we need to ask ourselves if a particularly good idea is what the Lord wants at the moment. E.g., should I leave my elderly neighbor to suffocate in his burning house because I must be at a prayer meeting at that moment? What if the invitation is to come to heaven?
